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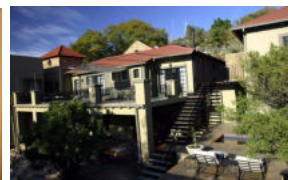
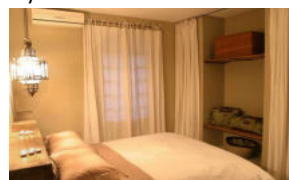


COMMON DUIKER SAFARI – 14 DAYS (NAM)
SAFARI IN NAMIBIA FROM WINDHOEK TO THE WATERBERG, TO ETOSHA NATIONAL PARK, THE OVAMBOLAND, EPUPA FALLS AND KAOKOLAND, DAMARALAND AND THE ERONGO MOUNTAINS



Short note about the following itinerary: The services mentioned in brackets are referring to the option **Self-Drive Safari**! The option **Guided Safari** includes all services as specified at the end of the itinerary.

Day 1: Arrival at the Windhoek Hosea Kutako International Airport in beautiful Namibia. Pick up your rented four-wheel driven vehicle or your guide will welcome you here. Drive to town. Overnight in an elegant room with en-suite facilities at **Olive Grove Guest House**. (Bed and Breakfast)



Day 2: After breakfast, drive north via Okahandja to the **Waterberg Plateau Lodge**, situated at the foot of the Waterberg. Spend the day here with a walk on the mountain and enjoy the view. Overnight here in a chalet with en-suite facilities. (Dinner, Bed and Breakfast)



Day 3: Drive via Rietfontein to the largest meteorite on earth on farm Hoba close to Grootfontein and continue via the mining town of Tsumeb, where you can visit the museum, to Lake Oshikoto and on to the famous Etosha National Park. Game-viewing drives in your own vehicle or with your guide in the eastern part of Etosha. If you are on a guided safari, your guide can explain animal behaviour, population dynamics, habitat and food preferences, and more. Visit the historical Fort Namutoni. Overnight in a room with en-suite facilities at the comfortable **Etosha King Nehale Lodge**, situated outside the King Nehale Gate of the park in Ovamboland's Andoni Plains. (Dinner, Bed and Breakfast)



Day 4: Game-viewing drives in eastern Etosha. Large numbers of antelope, giraffe and zebra - and the predators that stalk them, and huge, dusty elephants against the backdrop of the vast Etosha Pan are characteristic of the days in the park. Accommodation as on the previous day.



Day 5: Drive via Omuthiya through the communal area of the Ovamboland with its wide plains dotted with Makalani palms and traditional homesteads. Visit the interesting Nakambale museum at Olukonda. Continue to the **Ongula Village Homestead Lodge**. Learn more about Ovambo traditions in the homestead. Overnight here in a room with en-suite facilities. (Activity, Dinner, Bed and Breakfast)



Day 6: After breakfast drive via Oshakati through the characteristic landscapes of the Ovamboland to Ruacana on the Kunene River and visit the waterfall. Continue along the river to Swartbooisdrift and then on via Epembe and Okangwati to Epupa. Overnight in a chalet with en-suite facilities of the **Omarunga Epupa Falls Camp** on the banks of the Kunene River and close to the Epupa Falls. (Dinner, Bed and Breakfast)



Day 7: Your hosts will invite you for a visit to the Himba people. (Self-drivers have to book and settle all activities directly!) You will learn about their traditions, their way of living and the problems they face in a rapidly changing environment. It is respect - and not the demands of the tourist's tight schedule - that will determine these meetings with the people of one of the last nomadic tribes in Africa. Spend the rest of the day along the Kunene River. Accommodation as on the previous day.



Day 8: After an early start today, drive via Opuwo south-west through interesting landscapes via Kaoko Otavi and Orupembe to Puros and the luxurious **Okahirongo Elephant Lodge**. Overnight in a suite with en-suite facilities. (Dinner, Bed and Breakfast)



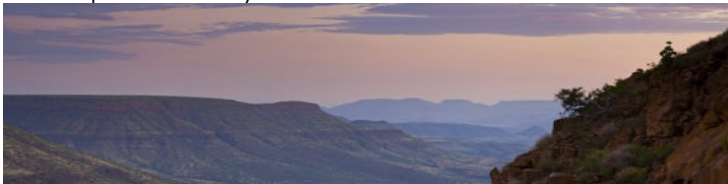
Day 9: Spend the day with own excursions in this unique area along the Hoarusib river. (Excursions can be booked with your hosts and have to be settled directly.) Accommodation as on the previous day.



Day 10: Today, drive south through stunning landscapes via Sesfontein and Palmwag to Damaraland and on to the **Grootberg Lodge**, situated on top of the Grootberg pass in a conservancy. Overnight in a chalet with en-suite facilities. (Dinner, Bed and Breakfast)



Day 11: Spend the day with your hosts and the offered guided walks and game-viewing drives in this unique area (to be settled directly by self-drivers). Accommodation as on the previous day.



Day 12: After breakfast, drive via Palmwag to Twyfelfontein to visit the age-old rock engravings and continue past Namibia's highest mountain, the Brandberg, via Uis

and Okombabe to **Ai-Aiba The Rock Painting Lodge**, situated in the wonderful Erongo Mountains. Guided walks can be undertaken by yourselves. Overnight here in a room with en-suite facilities. (Dinner, Bed and Breakfast)



Day 13: Spend the day with relaxing walks and enjoy the many beautiful sights of the Erongo. Relax at the pool of the lodge. Drives and visits to the rock art can be booked directly. Accommodation as on the previous day.



Day 14: In the course of the morning, drive via Omaruru and Wilhelmstal to Okahandja, where you can visit an interesting African market. Continue via the capital Windhoek to the Hosea Kutako International Airport where you can return your car or your guide will bid you farewell here, before you fly home.

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
